PURPOSE OF ROLE:

To conduct high quality teaching on undergraduate and postgraduate programmes in the areas of Social Work. The role will focus on delivering high quality education in a variety of formats. The person appointed will be expected to:

- Influence significantly the design and delivery of teaching activities, reflecting the successfully candidate's own subject specialism appropriate for the needs of a diverse student body; across the range of courses offered by the School.
- Engage in professional practice across the subject area and contribute to the profile of the School and Faculty.
- Support the delivering of the student experience.
