PURPOSE OF ROLE

The Livelihoods and Institutions Department at NRI is seeking to appoint a Lecturer in Development Economics/Development Studies: this will be a permanent, full-time appointment.

The Lecturer will be from an economics or other social science background with strong quantitative research skills and a proven capacity to conduct independent empirical research using modern impact evaluation techniques and other advanced analytical approaches. The ideal candidate will have extensive experience using statistical software such as Stata or R and be familiar with widely used secondary data sets such as LSMS, DHS, ACLED or more country-specific data-sets such as India's IHDS or Indonesia's IFLS. In addition, applicants will be expected to have significant interdisciplinary and mixed-methods primary data collection experience and to show promise of a strong international publications record.

Thematically, applicants should have experience in and knowledge of interdisciplinary, applied research on conflict and fragility in low-income settings, on climate change and adaptation, on poverty and gender or other inequality or on other related and pressing rural and other development challenges and themes.

The candidate will be expected to embrace NRI's and the University of Greenwich's core values of undertaking interdisciplinary, collaborative and impactful research being part of interdisciplinary and diverse teams and in equitable research partnerships involving academic, civil society and

grassroots institutions and/or colleagues both in the UK and across the Globe.
