PURPOSE OF ROLE:

This is a key role for the effective delivery of the Department's programmes and enhancement of student experience. It requires an innovative approach to course coordination, delivery and student support making full use of information technology but also applying theory to practice through structured lectures and seminars, project orientated work and case studies; site visits and other non-classroom based activities.

The primary purpose will be to design, develop, deliver and administer courses in Landscape Architecture within the Landscape Architecture programmes, enable the review and accreditation of those courses where applicable and provide academic and pastoral care to students registered on programmes, enhancing student experience whenever the opportunity arises. The post-holder may also be required to teach on other courses in the Department at the discretion of the Head of Department.

In addition, the post holder will be required to undertake high quality architectural research resulting in externally generated funding, peer-reviewed journal outputs, international publications or exhibitions.

KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES:

The post-holder will be based within the Architecture and Landscape Department. The post is currently located at the University's Stockwell Street in Greenwich. The successful candidate will be expected to work in any of the University's campuses and may be required to work in of the School's overseas centres.

All post-holders will be expected to:-

Generic:

The post-holder will be able to take on the responsibility for the effective delivery of a range of courses and ensure that they are properly administered including the collection and presentation of marks to the Progression and Award Board. The continual improvement of student experience will be a key activity for all teaching staff and will form an important part of this particular role within the Department. The post-holder will be required to act as personal tutor for students and undertake any necessary training to prepare for this activity.

The post-holder will make a major contribution to other aspects of the Department's activities and will be expected to attend meetings and other events both within and outside the School as required and will be expected to interact with a range of organisations including professional bodies, employers, schools and colleges.

Although this is a teaching post, the post-holder will be required to interact with an appropriate professional body at a senior level and generate income through enterprise, consultancy and CPD activities. The post-holder will be expected to inform their teaching through their professional practice.
