## **PURPOSE OF ROLE:**

The Natural Resources Institute of the University of Greenwich (NRI) is an internationally recognised centre excellence working on agriculture and food systems to benefit the poor. Research and teaching at the confluence of agriculture and nutrition is fairly new and the field is developing quickly and is an area that NRI is actively looking to expand. NRI currently has a growing research project portfolio in this area supported by key donors such as the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF), DFID and the EU. The successful applicant will be expected to contribute to growing NRI portfolio of work on the contribution of agriculture and food to nutrition security in developing countries. The post-holder will also contribute teaching in food/nutrition areas at undergraduate (including an apprenticeship in food) and postgraduate levels in NRI and potentially elsewhere in the faculty. He/she will contribute to NRI's Food Systems and potentially Development Studies Research Groups

The post-holder would be expected to contribute to the general work of the Department in the areas of food systems and market development. The post includes opportunities for research, enterprise and teaching.

NRI is keen to develop its teaching and learning offer in the area of food systems and nutrition and the post-holder will have opportunities to develop curricula and launch new courses at undergraduate and postgraduate levels.

#### **KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES:**

The post-holder will be based within Food and Markets Department but will also work with staff in other NRI Departments and with a range of NRI stakeholders.
