PURPOSE OF ROLE:

To conduct high quality teaching on undergraduate and postgraduate programmes on the School's District Nursing course and our pre-registration adult nursing modules. The role will focus on delivering high quality education in a variety of formats. The person appointed will be expected to:

- Contribute to the delivery of existing teaching, course development, and pedagogical/professional activity carried out in the school including review and re-approval of our District Nursing programmes
- Influence significantly the design and delivery of teaching activities, with a specific emphasis on community nursing and out of hospital care across the range of courses/modules offered by the School
- Engage in professional practice across community nursing and contribute to the profile of the School and Faculty
- Support the delivering of the student experience across the above programmes.
- Demonstrate emerging leadership in a subject area and a growing reputation and impact across the Faculty, University, and more widely.
