PURPOSE OF ROLE:

To conduct high quality research and teaching on undergraduate and postgraduate programmes in Computing / Computer Science expertise areas, including in:

(i) Software Engineering / Software Engineering Management

Areas covered include specialist knowledge regarding full software engineering lifecycle, traditional and contemporary software engineering methods and methodologies, e.g., agile development on a practical level, traditional and agile methods and frameworks, UML, OO programming etc.

(ii) Algorithms and Data Structures.

Areas covered include specialist knowledge regarding data structures such as single and double linked lists, hash tables and functions, collision avoidance etc. Trees used for sorting and searching including rebalancing. Nature of algorithms: including complexity, completeness, measures of efficiency.

(iii) Operating Systems

Areas covered include server and mobile OS, concurrency / synchronisation; threading and parallel CPU scheduling; distributed and network OS, covering Windows, UNIX, Linux, Android, iOS.



(iv) Programming Paradigms

Areas covered Include OOP and functional programming and relevant areas; indicative languages Python, Java, JavaScript, Scala, Kotlin, C++/C#, Erlang, Scheme, Clojure, Go, Rust, Ruby, Swift, etc.

(v) Web Development and Programming

Areas covered include Web and App development, Programming Languages (Python, Java, JavaScript, C#/C++, Swift, Kotlin, PHP/MYSQL, HTML/CSS and HTML Forms; Client/ Server interaction - HTTP Client-side scripting; CSS frameworks; Server-side PHP PDO programming; CSS frameworks; Relational databases; Relational databases Accessibility and user-testing; Programming tools and techniques (OOAD, OO). Sound technical experience with Agile, SCRUM, XP, KANBAN, SharePoint/Content Management etc.

(vi) Human-Computer Interaction and User Interface Design

Areas covered include but not limited to HCI/UID, Content Management Tools, UML/UI design, Agile, SCRUM, RUP, XP etc.) and Research Methods. Sound technical experience with SharePoint and other Content Management Systems as well as ability to document requirements using different methods, e.g., BPMN, User Stories, UML etc.

(vii) Database Management, Big Data and Data Analytics

Areas covered include Databases, Data Mining, Big Data, Data Analytics, Database Management and Administration, Relational Databases. Sound technical experience with Scrum, Power BI, and Tableau, MySQL, OOAD, UML, RDBMS, PHP/MYSQL, Oracle, NoSQL, Data Warehousing, BI & Visualisation, Graph Databases as well as ability to document requirements using different methods, e.g., BPMN, User Stories, and UML preferred.

The role will focus on delivering high quality education in a variety of formats ads well as research and enterprise activities, whilst ensuring the modules adhere to the criteria for British Computing Society accreditation. The person appointed will be expected to:

- Contribute to the delivery of existing teaching, course development, and to participate in the research carried out in the School.
- Contribute more widely to the design and delivery of teaching activities, reflecting the successfully candidate's own subject specialism appropriate for the needs of a diverse student body; across the range of courses offered by the School.
- · Be involved with research and scholarship as evidenced by publications,



research bids, participation in technical programme committees (TPCs) of reputable conferences, journal editorial board memberships, or similar.

Engage in research and professional practice across the subject area and contribute to the research profile of the School and to the UoA 11 REF submission of the School.
