PURPOSE OF ROLE:

The AHRC funded p_ART_icipate research project, investigates the potential for participatory art to promote and foster social inclusion, social connectedness and wellbeing for the public remotely. Based on existing practice-based research on the impact of immersive, collaborative art engagements, this research project is anchored in a wider discourse around the cultural and societal impact of participatory arts within the Arts and Humanities.

This research project led by the University of Greenwich examines how innovative art and technology can encourage social connectedness online, through collaborative, multisensory art strategies. In collaboration with experts in Arts & Health and Arts Therapy (CNWL NHS Foundation Trust, Brunel University), p_ART_icipate offers immediate use cases for participatory arts in a public health context, resulting in guidelines for artistic practitioners and healthcare professionals. This research contributes to a deeper understanding of collaborative online digital art interventions to help individuals affected by social isolation, whether in a private or professional context:

The University of Greenwich is looking for talented and motivated Research Fellow with the skills, knowledge, and enthusiasm to help the industry-academia network make significant research breakthroughs. A keen interest in public health, as well as the role of participatory art and design in this context is appreciated.

The RA will be part of a strong expert network consisting of the University of Greenwich, CNWL NHS Foundation Trust, The National Gallery, Royal National Institute of the Blind and others - and through interactions and collaborations will work towards joint project objectives.

To main purpose of the role is to conduct high quality research and data analysis of participatory art through analysis of qualitative and quantitative methods. To support and lead the implementation of our current AHRC-funded project by planning and undertaking research and capacity-building activities in accordance with the project's framework and in close collaboration with the project's partners.



The post is for fixed term and 0.5 FTE (2 and a half days a week)

Key areas: Public health, participatory art, Art & Health, social connectedness, codesign, mixed reality, media art, HCIs

The person appointed will be expected to:

- Undertake research, data analysis, report writing and data analysis activities within the framework of an AHRC-funded project
- Within the project, make a significant contribution to the development of appropriate work processes and methodologies, together with the implementation of project work.
- Analyse data, both qualitative and quantitative, focusing on the use of participatory, practice-based and co-creation methods in the field of media art, participatory art and art & health
- Play a significant role in progressing the project, including the coordination, implementation, and documentation of the project, as well as impact generation
- Work closely with project lead and collaborators, including participation in project meetings online, on campus and on site, as appropriate.
- Engage in research for the p_ART_icipate research project and in so doing contribute to the research profile of the School of Design and to the Art and Design (UoA 32) REF submission of the relevant research group.
- Contribute to the delivery of some high quality, public facing research events, conferences and industry talks, and presenting the work to relevant bodies including staff and students.
- Support the PI/ COI's and Project Lead in the delivery of outcomes for their research project
